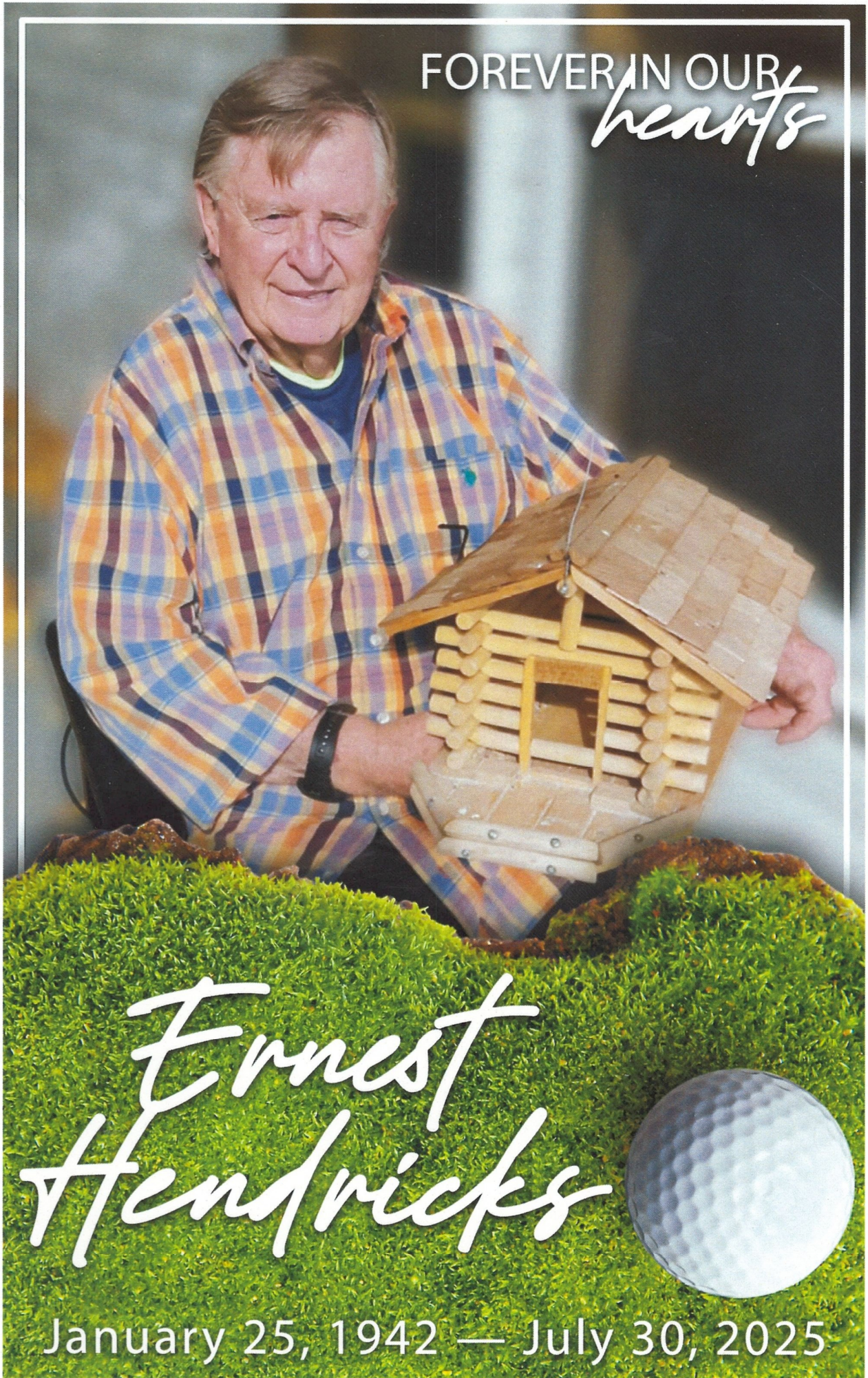


FOREVER IN OUR
